The game for:

- foreigners and guests from other cities who want to get to know Krakow in a non-standard manner
- lovers of Krakow wishing to become close friends with the city
- companies who find it important to combine good fun with team building and logical tasks

Challenge:

Divided into groups, you walk through the city jungle. On your way, like the characters of games and films, you find clues, meet mysterious figures, follow traces, decipher Latin inscriptions and first and foremost come closer to solving the intrigue against the Krakow legends.

Logistics:

- as part of the game, depending on the time variant, the participants have the possibility to visit a few places (tickets included)
- the game is conducted on foot, with no possibility to use the means of transport
- the weather should be moderate (we do not recommend the game between November and March)

Advantages:

- the opportunity to show your creativity, knowledge and intellect
- improving your wits, reflex and observation
- learning orienteering
- observing and drawing conclusions
- activating logical thinking
- good fun and integration

Variants / Extensions:

- the highlight of the game will be a feast or dinner in one of the restaurants connected with the history of Krakow
- the game can be accompanied by a training session in team management, including an extended feedback session after experiences in the field
