### The game for:

- companies who are fed up with ordinary ideas for integration

- teams wishing to celebrate their success or project completion in an unusual, active manner

#### Challenge:

You are peasants, but have been chosen by Bolesław II the Generous to join the royal retinue. Nevertheless, the road to obtain this honour is not easy. For a while, you have to become members of each social group of mediaeval Poland: the middle class, the clergy, the chivalry and the aristocracy. In each of them, you will acquire particular skills. As middle class people, you will take part in a street farce. As knights, you will learn the art of fencing and repair a coat of mail. As aristocrats, you will discover the secret of the royal clothes and hunt a fox. And as clergymen, you will prepare the tincture of medicinal and taste values – you will try it later, of course.

- another option any other castle/ruins with the surrounding area
